The club will host a **Desensitization Clinic** with George Cardoso on Saturday, April 20, from 9:00am to 3:00pm at the Kreitmans' home in Polk City. It is **limited to 20 participants;** there is no limit on those wishing to audit.

The day will begin with discussions of how horses think and see the world, and the role riders must play in being leaders for their equine partners. There will then be mounted practices that allow the riders to practice what they've learned.

George recently conducted this class for the Friends of Lake Louisa at \$110 per person—the club will be charging \$30 per participant and \$10 for auditors (lunch is included).

Twenty people registered at the March meeting; those people must pay their \$30 fee by March 30 by sending it to Susan Buchanon.

**Course Objectives:** 

1. Develop rider and horse confidence and trust.

2. Understand how your horse views you in the pecking order and how it effects training.

3. Recognize the importance of the onerein stop and how to apply it.

4. Identify the 5 parts of a horse and how to move them individually.

5. Understand the horse's "reactionary" response and what affects it.

6. Identify sight, sounds, touch, & multisensory stimuli.

7. Demonstrate proper rider position (seat) for maintaining balance.

8. Exposure to several stimuli while increasing intensity and safety.

9. "Making the right thing easy and the

wrong thing hard". 10. Understand and demonstrate "release of pressure"as a reward for positive choice.

A couple of the club's **personalized 2024 calendars** are still available. If you want one, please contact Janet Schneider. The cost is \$10.




The lovely Acorn Loop trail at Marshall Hampton Reserve is now
